
State Fire Training Textbooks

In January 2015, New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control's fire training program stopped providing textbooks for Firefighter 1, Basic Exterior Firefighting Operations "BEFO" (formerly Scene Support), and certain other courses.

As of January 2016, Cattaraugus County Office of Emergency Services has purchased a library of the book listed below that will be available for LOAN to students in active Firefighter 1 or BEFO classes. The books will be available at the first night of class and can be loaned upon turning in a signed Book Loan Agreement to the class instructor. The book can be used, gently and respectfully, throughout class and will be turned-in to the class instructor on or before the last scheduled day of class. Books that are damaged or not returned on the last day of class will be billed immediately to the fire department sponsoring the student.

If your department prefers, you may continue to purchase books for your students as you have over the past year. Those textbooks will need to be purchased ahead of time and brought to class with each student on the first night of class.
