Charles Couture, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

1.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mike Zaprowski moved with a second from Andrea Mellon to accept the minutes from the January 31, 2019 meeting. Motion was carried.

2.0 NEW BUSINESS

2.1 General Municipal Law Section 239 (l) & (m) Referrals

2.1 a. Village of Franklinville - Area Variance - 100 S Main St.

- The zoning law allows one sign on the building and one sign in front. The applicant wishes to install two additional signs in front.
- The pole sign on the southern end of the property is very close to infringing on the DOT right-of-way for Route 16. It is suggested that that sign be moved 8-10 feet deeper into the property.
- The information on the sandwich board sign should be relocated to the signs at either end of the property and the sandwich board sign removed.

- (2) The information on the sandwich board sign should be relocated to one of the other signs on the property. The sandwich board sign should then be removed.

2.1 b. Town of Persia – Comprehensive Plan Update

- The Town of Persia is producing a comprehensive plan. There is some question as to whether this is an updated or a new plan. The Town's Zoning Ordinance was created in 1973 and revised in 1995. There should have been a comprehensive plan produced prior to the adoption of the Zoning Ordinance, but one cannot be found.
- The information in the comprehensive plan seemed to cover most items required for a plan. Pat and I both reviewed it and most of our mark-ups were for clarification or to expand on certain items..
- It is our opinion that the Town should now update their Zoning Ordinance to put it into compliance with the Plan.
