EDL EZ-CHECKLIST

for New York State's Enhanced Driver Licenses (EDLs) or Non-Driver IDs Available for U.S. Citizens Who Are Residents of NYS

New York State's Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) Enhanced Driver License (EDL) is your single, secure document for driving, identity and border crossings by land and sea between the U.S., Canada, Mexico, Bermuda and the Caribbean.

Note: An EDL cannot be used for international air travel between the U.S. and other countries. Like a regular driver license, an EDL can be used for domestic air travel under current federal rules.

What to Know – Before You Apply for Your EDL

To obtain an EDL or an enhanced non-driver ID, you must apply in person at a DMV office. As part of the application process, you may be briefly interviewed by a DMV representative about your forms.

This EDL EZ-Checklist has been created to help prepare you for your DMV visit and your EDL or enhanced non-driver ID application.

If you are able to check every box throughout this form, you are eligible to apply for your EDL. Please bring only **original** documents or **government-certified** copies that you have selected from the checklist.

FDL-F7 Checklist

- Proof of United States Citizenship Please bring ONE of the following:
 - Valid U.S. Passport
 - Original or certified copy of U.S. Birth Certificate
 - Certificate of Naturalization
 - Certificate of Citizenship
 - U.S. Department of State Consular Report of Birth Abroad

- Proof of Identity Please bring ONE of the following:
 - Driver license, learner permit, or a nondriver photo ID issued by New York State
 - A combination of other documents equaling 6 points

- Social Security Card Please bring your card. Knowing your Social Security number is not enough.
- Proof of New York State Residence Please bring TWO of the following:

Note: Documents must list BOTH your name and current <u>residential</u> address.

- Driver license, learner permit, or a non-driver photo ID issued by NYS
- · NYS Certificate of Title
- · Property Deed
- · Residential Lease issued within the last year
- Proof of current mortgage
- Federal or NYS Income Tax W-2 (with SSN) issued within the last year
- Current proof of Homeowners/Renters insurance (policy, proof of claim)
- NYS Professional License
- Federal or NYS Income Tax or Earning Statement (1099, 1098)
- Unemployment Benefit Statement issued within the last year

Proofs of NYS residence (continued)

- · Retirement statement
- Original credit card statement on letterhead issued within the last 120 days
- Bank statement issued within the last 120 days
- · Military orders that are still in effect
- Computer printed pay stub (with name and address) issued within the last 120 days
- Utility bill with name and address issued within the last 120 days
- Life insurance policy or current statement issued within the last 120 days
- Social Security statement for the current year
- · Jury Duty notice issued within the last year

For a more complete list of documents which can be used as proofs of NYS residence, see Form ID-44EDL.

Fees

The fee for an EDL is \$30 in addition to the fees required for your driver license or non-driver photo ID transaction. In comparison, the cost of a U.S. passport is more than \$100.

You can apply for an EDL:

- at the time your driver license or ID is due for renewal, or
- to replace your current license prior to its expiration date, or
- as part of an early renewal option that extends the expiration date of your current license.

Payment is due when you apply. Cash, check, money order or credit card will be accepted. An EDL fee calculator is available at: www.nysdmv.com/edl.htm

Note: There will be an additional \$30 fee every time you renew your EDL (normally every 8 years).

MINORS

A child **under the age of 16** who is applying for an enhanced non-driver ID must have his/her parent or guardian present.

- If the child is between the ages of 16 and 18 and has the necessary proofs of identity, the parent or guardian does not need to be present as long as he/she has signed the back of the MV-44 form giving his/her consent to allow the minor to apply for a junior license or non-driver ID.
- If the child is between the ages of 16 and 18, but does not have the necessary proofs of identity, he/she must submit a MV-45 Statement of Identity by a Parent or Guardian, and his/her parent or guardian must be present to sign the form in the presence of a DMV representative.

Remember, the more prepared you are for your visit to the DMV, the smoother the application process will be.
