The Community Council of the Choices for Youth Program is comprised of health and human service, criminal justice, social services, social services and education professionals and meets quarterly to advise and provide oversight of the Choices for Youth program. In addition, ad hoc committees of members of the community and youth address service needs and share in selecting program proposals for subcontract funding. Our current Choices for Youth Program subcontract service providers are: Southern Tier Traveling Teachers, and the Andover Central School District.

### **After School Youth Centers**

In addition to subcontract services, other youth initiatives include an After School Youth Center in the Andover Central School District for students in grades 5 - 12 which includes a peer mentoring program and a Youth Advisory Board, a case management program for students in the *Salamanca Central School District*, the *Youth Speak Out events*, the *Cattaraugus County Youth Summit*, and the *Taste of Independence*. Cattaraugus-Allegany Workforce NY is the workforce development system that serves the community of Cattaraugus and Allegany Counties and is comprised of three major components - the Cattaraugus-Allegany Workforce Investment Board, Inc. (WIB), the One Stop Career Centers, and our Partner agencies. All three components work together to provide employment and training services to individual and business customers within our local area. Workforce development systems were enacted by the federal Workforce Investment Act (WIA) legislation to provide assistance to job seekers and businesses using WIA and other federal funds. WIA requires that each Local Workforce Investment Area must be governed by a Board of Directors comprised of no less than 51% business sector members and must have a business sector Chair. The Board's main responsibility is to set policy for the expenditure of public funds to provide services, which are delivery through the One Stop Career Centers. In addition, WIA requires that certain other federally-funded programs are mandated to participate in the One Stop delivery system as our Partner agencies in order to provide a seamless system of services to our customers. By visiting a One Stop Center, you have access to more than just the WIA program but to all programs that our Partners offer as well. This local workforce development service delivery system is directly accountable to the local WIB for its performance.
