# REQUESTING NEW YORK STATE LEGISLATURE ENACT SENATE BILL S.4784 AND ASSEMBLY BILL A.7310 REGARDING ADDITIONAL ONE PERCENT SALES TAX FOR CATTARAUGUS COUNTY

Pursuant to Section 40 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

- I. WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature authorized the imposition of an additional one percent sales tax in Cattaraugus County by Chapter 332 of the Laws of 2009 of the State of New York, and
- II. WHEREAS, that authorization expires November 30, 2011, and
- III. WHEREAS, the revenue generated by the additional one percent sales tax during 2010 was approximately \$9,119,083 million, and
- IV. WHEREAS, Senate Bill S.4784 and Assembly Bill A.7310 have been introduced in the New York State Legislature, which authorize the Cattaraugus County Legislature to implement an additional one percent sales tax for a term commencing December 1, 2011 and ending November 30, 2013, and
- V. WHEREAS, it is proposed that in its 2012 and 2013 budgets, Cattaraugus County allocate one-fourth (25%) of the net collections from the additional one percent sales tax to the towns, villages and cities in the County proportionately on the basis of the respective full valuation of the parcels of property in each such municipality, as determined by the County Treasurer and allocate the remainder of the net collections from such additional sales tax to the maintenance, repair, rehabilitation and replacement of the infrastructure in Cattaraugus County, and
- VI. WHEREAS, a necessity exists for the passage of such legislation by the New York State Legislature, now, therefore, be it
- I. RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby requests the New York State Legislature enact Senate Bill S.4784 and Assembly Bill A.7310, which authorizes the Cattaraugus County Legislature to implement an additional one percent sales tax, in accordance with the above-described terms, and be it further
- II. RESOLVED, that the County Attorney be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to submit one or more Home Rule Requests to the New York State Legislature pursuant hereto, and be it further
- III. RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to forward certified copies of this resolution to Senator Young and Assembly Member Giglio.

- IV. WHEREAS, the retention, creation and expansion of small businesses, including farms and other agribusinesses, and industrial and other commercial endeavors is also of paramount importance, and
- V. WHEREAS, Local Law No. 20-2003 (Intro No. 21-2003), adopted by the Cattaraugus County Legislature on November 12, 2003, established the Cattaraugus County Hotel and Motel Tax, and

- III. RESOLVED, that the Department shall review such applications and determine which businesses and events shall be promoted by the County from a portion of the Hotel and Motel tax receipts during the succeeding year, and it is further

RESOLVED, that during the month of January, 2012 and in each year thereafter, the Department is authorized and directed to seek proposals from marketing professionals to promote such activities and events by advertising and by such other means as the Director of the Department deems appropriate, and be it further
