V. WHEREAS, the Music Educator Award was established to recognize current educators (kindergarten through college, public and private schools) who have made a significant and lasting contribution to the field of music education and who demonstrate a commitment to the broader cause of maintaining music education in the schools, and

VI. WHEREAS, The Recording Academy and Grammy Foundation created this award to highlight the extraordinary influence of music teachers on their students in and beyond the classroom, and

VII. WHEREAS, Mr. Knappenberger’s achievement as recipient of the first Annual Music Educator Grammy award brings honor and recognition to all of Western New York, now, therefore, be it

I. RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby congratulates Kent Knappenberger on being named the first recipient of the Music Educator Award, and be it further

SUPPORTING USE OF CROSSBOWS FOR HUNTING IN NEW YORK STATE

Pursuant to Section 153 of the County Law.

I. WHEREAS, New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) “supports the use of crossbows for hunting during all seasons in which other bowhunting equipment is allowed” (see *Division of Fish, Wildlife and Marine Resources, Management Plan for White-tailed Deer in New York State 2012-2016*), and

II. WHEREAS, according to Cornell University, Department of Natural Resource, *Final Report: Statewide Deer Hunter Survey – 2010*:

- “about one-half of respondents (51%) thought crossbows should be legalized for all hunters during any season when bows currently are legal (i.e., archery and regular firearms season),
- only 19% thought that use of crossbows should be limited to the regular firearms season, and
- the vast majority of respondents also thought that crossbows should be legalized for senior hunters (68%) or for disabled hunters (78%)”,

and

III. WHEREAS, “If crossbows were legalized, about 43% of bowhunters and 39% of big game hunters who do not hunt with a bow “definitely” or “probably” would use one” (see Cornell University, Department of Natural Resource, *Final Report: Statewide Deer Hunter Survey – 2010*), and

IV. WHEREAS, a large segment of New York State deer hunters have given up bow hunting because they can no longer draw a vertical bow due to age-related issues, and

V. WHEREAS, presently in New York State, the crossbow regulations for handicapped persons are so restrictive that only 36 modified crossbow permits were issued between 2008 and June 2013, and the restrictions on modified archers’ permits average less than 300 permits issued each year since 2008 (information provided by NYSDEC), and

VI. WHEREAS, since 2002, over 34 states have changed restrictions on the use of crossbows during a hunting season, and

VII. WHEREAS, incorporating crossbows into game management may additionally increase hunter recruitment and retention, and

VIII. WHEREAS, the New York Farm Bureau and the State Level Sportsmen Community, including but not limited to, the NYS Conservation Council, the Conservation Alliance of NY, 4H Shooting Sports, National Wild Turkey Federation, four NY Chapters of Safari Club International, the New York Sportsmen’s Advisory

Council, as well as County Federation of Sportsmen's Clubs, and numerous other County Sportsmen's Federations and Alliances, Local Sportsmen's Clubs support the use of crossbows for hunting during the archery and regular firearms hunting seasons, now, therefore, be it

I. RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby supports the use of crossbows as a hunting implement in New York State during the archery and regular firearms hunting seasons, and be it further

II. RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby directed to forward a copy of this resolution to Governor Cuomo, Senator Young, Assembly Member Giglio, the New York State Association of Counties, the Western New York Inter-County Association, the New York State Department of Conservation and the New York State Crossbow Coalition.
