LOCAL LAW NUMBER 4-2014 COUNTY OF CATTARAUGUS, NEW YORK

Pursuant to Article 12 of the Correction Law and Section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

A LOCAL LAW ESTABLISHING A LOCAL CONDITIONAL RELEASE COMMISSION

BE IT ENACTED by the County Legislature of the County of Cattaraugus as follows:

SECTION 1.	There is hereby established a local conditional release commission to be known as the
"Cattaraugus C	ounty Conditional Release Commission" (hereinafter "the Commission").
SECTION 2.	The Commission shall have and exercise all the functions and duties provided by Article 12 of
the Correction	Law of the State of New York.
SECTION 3.	There shall be five (5) members of the Commission who shall be appointed by the County
Legislature.	
SECTION 4.	The term of office of each member of such Commission shall be four (4) years; provided,
however, that a	any member chosen to fill a vacancy occurring otherwise than by the expiration of a term shall be
appointed for t	he remainder of the unexpired term of the member whom the person is to succeed.
SECTION 5.	Each member of the Commission shall receive such compensation as may from time to time be
established by	resolution adopted by the County Legislature.
SECTION 6.	Each member of the Commission shall have graduated from an accredited four-year college or
university and	shall have had at least five (5) years of experience in the field of criminology, administration of
criminal justice	, law enforcement, probation, parole, law, social work, social science, psychology, psychiatry or
corrections.	
SECTION 7.	Members of the Commission may be removed by the County Legislature, after notice and an
opportunity to	be heard.
SECTION 8.	The Probation Director or his/her designee shall serve as an ex-officio, non-voting member of
the Commission	n.
SECTION 9.	The Probation Department shall assign staff support to the Commission.
SECTION 10.	Effective Date. This local law shall take effect immediately.
