AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE AMENDED CONTRACT WITH GREENMAN-PEDERSEN, INC. FOR ENGINEERING CONSULTANT SERVICES FOR 2011-2012 BRIDGE PAINTING PROGRAM

ABOLISHING ONE POSITION OF RISK AND INSURANCE MANAGER, AND CREATING ONE POSITION OF INSURANCE AND WORKERS COMPENSATION COORDINATOR IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES AND ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION FOR SAME

WHEREAS, this restructuring requires the abolition of the Risk and Insurance Manager position, and the creation of an Insurance and Workers Compensation Coordinator position, and

WHEREAS, the New Position Duties Statement has been submitted to the Cattaraugus County Civil Service Commission, which has approved and certified the title of Insurance and Workers Compensation Coordinator, in accordance with Section 22 of the Civil Service Law, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that effective May 4, 2013 there is hereby abolished one position of Risk and Insurance Manager, in the Human Resources Department, and be it further

RESOLVED, that effective May 6, 2013, there is hereby created one position of Insurance and Workers Compensation Coordinator in the Human Resources Department, to be compensated at a rate of \$1,923.00 bi-weekly (\$49,998 annually), Management/Confidential salary plan.
