AUTHORIZING CHAIR TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS WITH CORNELL COOPERATIVE EXTENSION OF ALLEGANY AND CATTARAUGUS COUNTIES FOR THE CONTINUED OPERATION OF THE 4-H PROGRAM AND VEGETABLE AND GRAPE TEAM IN CATTARAUGUS COUNTY AND TRANSFER OF FUNDS

(Contingent Fund – Cornell)

Pursuant to Sections 224(8), 363, 365 and 450 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, for many years the Cattaraugus County Legislature has, for the benefit of its taxpayers and residents, and particularly its large farming community, provided significant funding for the continued existence and operation of programs offered by Cornell Cooperative Extension of Allegany and Cattaraugus Counties ("CCE"), and

WHEREAS, in 2012, New York State initiated a Property Tax Cap program that limited the amount of property taxes that could be levied by the County in that year and thereafter, causing significant reductions in levels of funding available for programs and services provided by all contract agencies and by the County itself, and

WHEREAS, in 2012, the Legislature reduced the amount of such funding when it became known that CCE had experienced financial difficulties caused, at least in part, by its failure to establish and utilize sufficient financial controls for the operation of the organization, and

WHEREAS, the financial stability of CCE was further seriously compromised in the years 2013 and 2014, causing the Legislatures of both Cattaraugus and Allegany Counties in late 2014 to jointly fund an independent audit of the organization, and

WHEREAS, the independent auditor has reported to county officials that CCE has failed to provide the financial records necessary to complete the audit, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature is deeply committed to providing for the continued existence of the 4-H program, which has benefitted many families for almost a century, and

WHEREAS, the 2015 Cattaraugus County budget, adopted by the Legislature on November 25, 2014, includes an appropriation of \$84,849.00, the amount requested by CCE, for the continued operation of the 4-H program in the County, and

WHEREAS, after further negotiations with the CCE Board and staff, and at the request of Cattaraugus County, the CCE Board has voted to dissolve the existing two-county association, and

WHEREAS, this Legislature intends to develop and provide funding for a Cooperative Extension Association in Cattaraugus County as soon as such association is created pursuant to §224 of the County Law, and

WHEREAS, pending the creation of a new Cooperative Extension Association in Cattaraugus County, the Legislature is willing to fund the continued operation of 4-H in Cattaraugus County by CCE until October 1, 2015 on the condition that CCE will progress toward and complete such dissolution in a prudent and diligent manner and that such dissolution be complete no later than September 30, 2015, and

WHEREAS, in the event that such dissolution is completed before September 30, 2015, the Chair should be authorized without the enactment of further legislation to contract with CCE's successor for the continuation of the 4-H program until October 1, 2015, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature also desires to provide requested funding for the vegetable and grape team to provide educational and other services in Cattaraugus County for the year 2015, and WHEREAS, a transfer of funds is necessary, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Legislature be, and hereby is, authorized to execute contracts, on behalf of Cattaraugus County, with Cornell Cooperative Extension of Allegany and Cattaraugus Counties ("CCE") or with such other entity as may be approved by the County Attorney, to fund the 4-H program in the County for the months of January through September, 2015 for a sum not to exceed \$87,000.00, which contract shall be subject to the approval of the County Attorney and contain, *inter alia*, the following terms:

- a. The County will, within thirty (30) days following the execution thereof, and upon the receipt of an invoice therefor, pay to CCE the sum of \$29,000.00 to be applied only to and for the operation, staffing and other expenses of the 4-H program in Cattaraugus County for the months of January, February and March, 2015;
- Upon the submission of invoices therefor, and upon the receipt of documentation acceptable to the County Administrator detailing the expenses incurred by CCE for the operation of such program for the months of April through September, 2015, the County will reimburse CCE for such expenses;
- c. In the event that CCE uses any part of the funding hereby authorized for any purpose other than the operation of the 4-H program in this County, such information shall be reported to the Chairman of the Legislature and the Chairman and Vice-Chairman of the Development and Agriculture Committee of the Legislature, which shall consider the matter at its next meeting, and upon the affirmative vote of a majority of such committee and due notice by certified mail to CCE, the County's obligation to make further payments to CCE pursuant to the contract to shall immediately cease and the contract will thereafter be void and of no further effect; and
- d. CCE, its board of directors having voted on February 17, 2015 to dissolve the existing two-county association, will proceed with all due haste and diligence to accomplish that goal and such dissolution shall be complete no later than September 30, 2015,

SUPPORTING GOVERNOR CUOMO'S PROPOSED DISTRIBUTION OF JPMORGAN CHASE SETTLEMENT FUNDS TO CDFIs

Pursuant to Section 153 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, the State of New York has settled its claim against JPMorgan Chase ("Chase") arising out of its sub-prime mortgage lending activities for consideration paid by Chase in the amount of \$250 million, and

WHEREAS, Governor Cuomo's proposed use of the settlement funds includes \$70 million to be used for the purpose of revitalizing commercial and residential properties, a portion of which may benefit Cattaraugus County's proposed land bank, and

WHEREAS, the Governor also proposes to use \$15 million of the settlement proceeds to fund low cost financing and access to capital through Community Development Financial Institutions ("CDFI"), which act as alternative lenders, technical assistance providers and advocates for underserved communities and provide a range of affordable, flexible and fair financial services and products to underserved individuals and communities, including loans to homeowners, housing developers, small businesses and community organizations, and

WHEREAS, the Seneca Nation of Indians Economic Development Company ("SNIEDC"), located in Salamanca, New York, is the only native CDFI in New York State certified by the Federal Treasury Department, out of a total of 67 CDFIs in the state, and

WHEREAS, since its inception, SNIEDC has provided over \$5 million in business loans to enrolled Seneca members for local economic development on Seneca Territories, and

WHEREAS, the proposed financing for CDFIs is the fulfilment of legislation passed by the Assembly in 2007 that was placed on hold in the face of recession, and

WHEREAS, the proposed appropriation to CDFIs will make it possible for SNIEDC to continue to make commercial and home mortgage loans on Seneca Territory for which there are no other financing sources and to help entrepreneurs start businesses and create jobs to revitalize their communities and improve the quality of life on the Territories and for all residents of Cattaraugus County and Western New York, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Cattaraugus County Legislature hereby declares its support for Governor Cuomo's proposed distribution of \$15 million from the proceeds of the State's settlement of its lawsuit against JPMorgan Chase to the CDFIs in New York, including SNIEDC, and urges its state legislators to support such distribution, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature is hereby authorized and directed to forward certified copies of this resolution to Governor Andrew Cuomo, Seneca Nation of Indians President Maurice John, Senator Dean Skelos, Senator Catharine Young, Speaker of the Assembly Carl Heastie, Assemblyman Joseph Giglio, and Lucille Brooks, Executive Director of SNIEDC.
