WHEREAS, voting machines are accessible to people with disabilities and are the result of a Federal Court Order in the U.S. District Court, Northern District of New York, to comply with the Help America Vote Act (HAVA), and

WHEREAS, all Cattaraugus County voters vote on the Dominion Imagecast Optical Scan voting machines, and

WHEREAS, the job duties and responsibilities of the voting machine Technicians for machines are as follows:

- Receipt of all Dominion Imagecast Optical Scan Voting Machines;
- Physical inspection of all machines, according to checklist;
- Acceptance testing and control of Mechanical Voting Machines and Dominion Imagecast Optical Scan Voting Machines;
- Inventory control of Dominion Imagecast Scan Voting Machines;
- Inventory and storage of all ballots used;
- Delivery and custody of Dominion Imagecast Scan Voting Machines from the warehouse to the poll sites and return to the warehouse;
- Maintain security at storage warehouse;
- Determine warehouse layout to be the most cost effective in terms of storage per square foot;
- Perform mandated quarterly testing of Optical Scan Voting Machines; and
- Any other duties deemed necessary,

and

AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE GRANT DOCUMENTS WITH NYS DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE SERVICES FOR CRIME PREVENTION AND REDUCTION STRATEGIES PROGRAMS

Pursuant to Chapter 53 of the Laws of New York of 2015 and Section 450 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, Act 470-2015 authorized the Chair to execute a contract with NYS Division of Criminal Justice Services for a joint grant in the amount of \$75,000.00 in Bullet Aid funding which was awarded to Cattaraugus and Allegany Counties for the Southern Tier Regional Drug Task Force from state funds for Crime Prevention and Reduction Strategies Programs allocated to New York State for the 2015-2016 State Fiscal Year, and

WHEREAS, funding is available in the amount of \$90,000.00, to be equally split with Allegany County, for the Crime Prevention and Reduction Strategies Programs for the 2016-2017 State Fiscal Year, and

WHEREAS, Cattaraugus County shall act as lead agency, on behalf of Allegany County, to process costs incurred by both County Sheriff's Offices in the fighting of illegal drug activity, combating drug trafficking and conducting investigations, and in support of efforts related to the Southern Tier Regional Drug Task Force, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to apply for the aforementioned funding, and

WHEREAS, if the aforementioned grant is awarded, each County shall receive funding in the amount of \$45,000.00 to cover costs incurred through the aforementioned purposes, and

WHEREAS, this program is 100% state funded (NYS Object Code #LG16-1465-D00 Project ID), now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Legislature be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute grant documents, in order to apply for, accept and receive the aforementioned funding, for a term commencing January 1, 2017 and terminating December 31, 2017, according to the above-described terms, and be it further
