AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE SUPPLEMENTAL AGREEMENT NO. 2 WITH NYSDOT ASHFORD BRIDGE NO. 37 FEDERAL-AID REHABILITATION PROJECT AND ADJUSTING VARIOUS APPROPRIATION AND REVENUE ACCOUNTS (Department of Public Works)

Pursuant to Title 23 U.S. Code and Sections 363, 366 and 450 of the County Law.

WHEREAS, this project is 65.7% federally (CFDA #20.205), 16% state and 18.3% county funded, and

WHEREAS, various appropriation and revenue accounts must be adjusted, now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, Act 95-2007, as amended, authorized a contract with Stantec Consulting Services, Inc., 2250 Brighton-Henrietta Town Line Road, Rochester, New York 14623-2706, for the provision of engineering services for the New Albion Bridge No. 35 Replacement Project located on Tannery Street over Tributary South Branch Cattaraugus Creek, BIN 3-32281-0, in the Town of New Albion, the term of which expires December 31, 2017, and

WHEREAS, engineering services for the preliminary design work are required to complete the final design report, and

WHEREAS, the term of the aforementioned contract should be extended to December 31, 2018, in order to complete the preliminary design work, and

WHEREAS, this program is 100% federally funded, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Legislature be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to execute a contract, on behalf of Cattaraugus County, with the New York State Department of Health,

in order to obtain the aforementioned funding for the Children with Special Health Care Needs, for a term commencing October 1, 2017 and terminating September 30, 2020, according to the above-described terms, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Legislature be, and hereby is, further authorized and directed to execute contract amendments, upon notification of award, for the allocation of additional state aid funding or cost of living adjustments (COLAs) for this program, and be it further

WHEREAS, the Program is operated by Cattaraugus Community Action, Inc. and is 100% funded through the New York State Department of State's Community Services Block Grant discretionary funding program (CFDA #93.558), and

WHEREAS, Cattaraugus Community Action, Inc., is requesting an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00, to be paid as tuition for up to 18 participants at the rate of \$2,700.00 per student for a 15 week cycle which includes ServSafe Certificate, Work Readiness Credential, Financial Literacy Certificate, and the Culinary Arts Certificate, and

WHEREAS, in the event a student drops out within the first four (4) weeks of class (20 classes), consideration will be as follows:

1 to 10 days – charge of \$36.00 per day (up to 10 days)

11 to 20 days – charge of \$1,200 for tuition per student,

and

WHEREAS, the County is desirous of contributing an amount not to exceed \$25,000.00 to support the aforementioned program, which shall be made in monthly installments, now, therefore, be it
