Crystal Abers reported

- Staff has been working on the LUCA/ Census addresses. The goal will be to use
  the maps and addresses that we currently have from the County 911 system and
  Real Property and merge with the data the Census will be providing.
- April 11<sup>th</sup> will be our Annual Farmer Neighbor Dinner. Mark Printz will be the guest speaker. There are only 30 tickets left.
- Broadband Update: Armstrong has been awarded the Phase II and Phase III for our area, however they have not accepted Round Three as of yet. Armstrong has attended meetings in the towns of Ashford and Little Valley to update the municipalities on the project. Addresses can be searched in the tool bar on the interactive map.
- March storm: EDPT staff called over 350 farms and businesses in Cattaraugus County to get an estimate on the damage caused by the March 1<sup>st</sup> winter storm. It is estimated that there was between \$350,000 and \$400,000 damage in Cattaraugus County.

- Zombie Property List from DFS. Have been contacting the banks to discuss 9
  properties in the County but have not received call / email back.

 Contractors were not able to do the assessments but came in to do the stakeholder meeting with the 7 municipalities on March 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>.
